## **CONSENT ORDER**

The Louisiana Professional Engineering and Land Surveying Board [hereinafter the "Board"], by and through its Executive Director, pursuant to authorization by the Board, and John P. Sipes [hereinafter "Respondent"], hereby agree to the following:

At all times material hereto, Respondent was not licensed in the State of Louisiana as a professional engineer and, therefore, was not authorized to practice and/or offer to practice engineer in the State of Louisiana.

An investigation was opened based upon the Board's receipt of information which suggested that Respondent may have engaged in the unlicensed practice of and/or offering to practice engineering in Louisiana. The investigation disclosed that since at least the early 1990s Respondent admittedly has been designing building foundations in Louisiana and that in 2012 he admittedly designed the foundation (and issued to his client foundation design drawings prepared by his unlicensed draftsman) for a proposed addition to a commercial warehouse for Southern Steel & Supply in Shreveport, Louisiana.

La. R.S. 37:681 and 37:700(A)(1) prohibit the practicing of and/or offering to engineering in Louisiana without proper licensure. La. R.S. 37:700(H) permits the Board to take enforcement action against persons who violate La. R.S. 37:681 and 37:700(A)(1) upon a finding of guilt following the preferral of charges, notice and hearing and a proper licensure.

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majority vote of its entire membership authorized to participate in the proceeding. La. R.S. 37:681, 37:700(A)(1) and 37:700(H) were in effect at all times material hereto.

It is undisputed that **(a)** at all times material hereto Respondent was not licensed to practice and/or offer to practice engineering in Louisiana; **(b)** since at least the early 1990s Respondent has been designing building foundations in Louisiana; and **(c)** in 2012 Respondent designed the foundation (and issued to his client foundation design drawings prepared by his unlicensed draftsman) for a proposed addition to a commercial warehouse for Southern Steel & Supply in Shreveport, Louisiana.

By letter dated September 14, 2012, the Board gave notice to Respondent that it was considering the preferral of charges against Respondent on the grounds that he may have violated La. R.S. 37:681 and 37:700(A)(1), relative to practicing and/or offering to practice engineering in Louisiana without proper licensure.

Wishing to dispense with the need for further enforcement action and to conclude the instant proceeding without further delay and expense, for the purpose of this proceeding only, Respondent and the Board do hereby enter into this Consent Order, in which Respondent of his own free will consents to the issuance of a Consent Order by the Board, wherein Respondent agrees to (a) pay a fine of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars, (b) pay administrative costs of four hundred seven and 28/100 (\$407.28) dollars, (c) immediately cease and desist from designing building foundations, issuing building foundation design drawings prepared by unlicensed draftsmen, and otherwise practicing and/or offering to practice engineering in Louisiana until such time as he is duly licensed by the Board, and (d) the publication of this Consent Order on the Board's website and a summary of this matter in the Board's official journal, the Louisiana Engineer and Surveyor Journal, and the reporting of this matter to the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES), identifying Respondent by name.

Respondent admits to violations of the referenced laws and/or rules regarding the practicing of and/or offering to practice engineering in Louisiana without proper licensure. Respondent acknowledges awareness of said laws and/or rules and states that he will comply with all applicable laws and rules henceforth. Respondent has been advised of his right to be represented by counsel before the Board and/or to appear at any hearing personally or by counsel and present witnesses and evidence in his own behalf, and he hereby waives this right and his right to appeal; and he states affirmatively that he has been afforded all administrative remedies due him under the law.

Therefore, in consideration of the foregoing and by signing this Consent Order, Respondent does hereby waive his right to a hearing before the Board, to the presenting of evidence and witnesses in his behalf, to Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in this case, and to judicial review of this Consent Order.

Respondent hereby represents (a) that he fully understands the meaning and intent of this Consent Order, including but not limited to its final and binding effect, (b) that he has voluntarily entered into this Consent Order and that no other promise or agreement of any kind has been made to or with him by any person whatsoever to cause the execution of this instrument and (c) that the sanctions set forth in this Consent Order do not prevent the Board from taking further disciplinary or enforcement action against Respondent on matters not specifically addressed in this Consent Order.

WHEREFORE, the Louisiana Professional Engineering and Land Surveying Board and Respondent agree that:

1. Respondent shall pay a fine of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars, which shall be tendered to the Board by certified check payable to the Board, due upon the signing of this Consent Order; and

2. Respondent shall pay administrative costs of four hundred seven and 28/100 (\$407.28) dollars, which shall be tendered to the Board by certified check payable to the Board, due upon the signing of this Consent Order; and

3. Respondent shall immediately cease and desist from designing building foundations, issuing building foundation design drawings prepared by unlicensed draftsmen, and otherwise practicing of and/or offering to practice engineering in

Louisiana until such time as he is duly licensed by the Board; and

4. The Consent Order shall be published on the Board's website and a summary of this matter shall be printed in the official journal of the Board, the <u>Louisiana</u>

<u>Engineer and Surveyor Journal</u>, and reported to the National Council of Examiners for

Engineering and Surveying (NCEES), identifying Respondent by name; and

5. This Consent Order shall not become effective unless and until it is accepted and signed by and on behalf of the Board. Should the Board not accept and sign this Consent Order, it is agreed that presentation of this matter to the Board shall not prejudice the Board or any of its members, staff, attorneys or representatives from further participation, consideration, or resolution of any further proceedings herein.
