### 24 **Application Reviews**

31 The Board reviewed the application of Mr. Paul **Lynes** for licensure as a  
32 professional engineer by comity. After discussion, the Board unanimously  
33 approved the motion made by Mr. Nelson, seconded by Mr. Racca, to deny the  
34 application based on not satisfying the educational requirements of the Board.

### 35 **Finance Committee**

36 Ms. Bergeron presented the financial report for FY 23-24. After discussion, the  
37 Board unanimously approved the motion made by the Finance Committee to  
38 accept the end of year budget for FY 23-24.

39 Ms. Bergeron presented the recommendations from the Building Committee to

41 discussion, the Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Racca,  
42 seconded by Mr. Nelson, to amend the FY 24-25 budget to add these items.

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

9 Ms. Williams, to approve all committee recommendations and actions.  
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
11 The Board unanimously approved the motion made by Mr. Benoit, seconded by
